

# Culter Hillwalking Club

**NEXT WALK – Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> October 2015**

**Carn na Drochaide**

**Distance 12 km. Ascent 570 metres. OS map 43**

We will park at [NO116909](#) by the road near the Linn of Quoich. We cross the bridge and follow the track which continues the line of the road as far as the house at Allanmore. Just beyond here we begin to ascend on a faint path to the summit of Creag a'Cheirich. From here we descend a short distance to a col, and then ascend off-path to the summit of Carn na Drochaide ([NO127938](#)). There are views to towards Lochnagar to the south, and Ben Avon to the north. We continue along the ridge to Carn na Criche and descend from here to pick up the track which goes back to our starting point at Linn of Quoich.

Total Time: Approx. 5-6 hours

**Note: Some moderately steep climbing . Requires a moderate level of fitness.**

**Meet at Culter Village Hall at 8.00am.**

**Return time approx 5.30pm**

**Transport by shared cars (contribution to the drivers towards petrol)**
