

# Culter Hillwalking Club

**NEXT WALK – Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> November 2015**

**Carn Leac Saighdeir**

**Distance 12 km. Ascent 500 metres. OS map 37**

A perfect walk for autumn! An easy climb, all on tracks, with even a short burst of tarmac at the very end – but well worth the modest effort for some delightful 360 degree views of our wonderful mountains and down Donside. We shall park at Corgarff Castle car park, 255090, and head south towards Carn Mor on our way to Carn Meadhonach. From here we head east continuing up to Carn Leac Saighdeir, where we shall stop for a Gaelic pronunciation and comprehension examination... From there we drop down to an Old Military Road, capitalised as per the map, which meanders through woodland and pasture across a delightful old Wade bridge back to our starting point. Then off to Goodbrands for a well-deserved drink.

Total Time: Approx. 4-5 hours

**Note: Some moderate climbs on the walk, requires an appropriate level of fitness.**

**Meet at Culter Village Hall at 8.30am.**

**Return time approx 5.30pm**
